**OPERATIONAL REPORT**

The District’s Autumn surveillance program continued throughout the month. District personnel continue to routinely inspect public areas, such as street gutters, catch basins, box drains, swimming pools, etc., for any evidence of mosquito breeding. No breeding was found in the areas that were inspected.

The San Gabriel Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District (SGVMVCD) conducted residential mosquito control applications via truck in the city of Baldwin Park. The SGVMCD used ultra-low volume larvicide applications to target mosquitoes at multiple stages to control population and reduce the risk of mosquito born disease. This took place on November 1<sup>st</sup> and November 4<sup>th</sup> from 12am to 5am. The treatments occurred in the area between Ramona Boulevard and Interstate 10, east of Interstate 605.

**MANAGER’S REPORT**

**Public Education**

The District has continued its public awareness campaign to promote public safety through effective mosquito control and shared public responsibility. Social media platforms are being updated daily with information, stories, and best practices for protecting yourself from mosquitoes. District personnel are also in the neighborhoods daily, distributing mosquito awareness literature and promoting the District’s message directly to residents. On November 9, 2024, the District participated in a Town Hall Meeting for Compton City Councilman Jonathan Bowers of the 3<sup>rd</sup> District. The Town Hall took place at Burrell-McDonald Park at 2516 W. Alondra Blvd. Compton, California 90220.

### Compton Creek Maintenance

Rivers Project Manager Julio Ramos of the U.S Army Corp of Engineers (USACE) stated that USACE is still in litigation regarding contract approvals. The USACE has Compton Creek slated for sediment removal. Mr. Ramos stated that the District will receive an update in December regarding the USACE legal position along with a new date for Compton Creek to have the sediment removed.

### Annexation

The General Manager of Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District (Susanne Kluh) confirmed that the Resolution 2024-21 for the Annexation was approved and signed.

### District Modernization Program

The District has received approval from the California State Water Resources Control Board to drain the Mosquito-Fish Pond directly into the flood channel adjacent to the District Office. Confirmation of this decision was given by Water Resource Control Engineer Gurgan Chand of the NPDES Wastewater Unit / Division of Water Quality. A meeting with LPA Inc. and the District took place on October 31, 2024, to discuss the direction of the District Modernization Program. The result of the meeting determined that the focus of the District Modernization Program will be repairs and upgrades to the Mosquito Fishpond.
