OPERATIONAL REPORT

The District continued its spring surveillance program which began in the month of April and continued inspections for mosquito breeding throughout the month of May. District personnel continue to routinely inspect public areas, such as street gutters, catch basins, box drains, swimming pools, etc., for any evidence of mosquito breeding. Breeding was found in one area inspected. The breeding found was eliminated. The District tested Compton Creek for breeding in the month of April. No breeding was found in Compton Creek.

MANAGER’S REPORT

Public Education

The District has continued its public awareness campaign to promote public safety through effective mosquito control and shared public responsibility. Social media platforms are being updated daily with information, stories, and best practices for protecting yourself from mosquitoes. District personnel are also in the neighborhoods daily, distributing mosquito awareness literature and promoting the District’s message directly to residents.
