OPERATIONAL REPORT

The District began its fall surveillance program which included inspections for mosquito breeding which started on the 22nd of September. District personnel continue to routinely inspect public areas, such as street gutters, catch basins, box drains, swimming pools, etc., for any evidence of mosquito breeding. The area(s) in which breeding was found were treated appropriately.

MANAGER’S REPORT

Public Education

The District has continued its public awareness campaign to promote public safety through effective mosquito control and shared public responsibility. Social media platforms are being updated daily with information, stories, and best practices for protecting yourself from mosquitoes. District personnel are also in the neighborhoods daily, distributing mosquito awareness literature and promoting the District’s message directly to residents.

On October 4, 2025, CCMAD participated in the Compton Walk for a Cure that took place at Centennial High School, 2606 N. Central Ave, CA 90222. The General Manager of CCMAD provided attendees with informational pamphlets and discussed information regarding mosquito breeding prevention and West Nile Virus.

West Nile Virus

On October 2, 2025, the Coachella Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District conducted aerial treatment in the city of Palm Springs. This was due to mosquito samples testing positive for West Nile Virus.

On October 13, 2025, the San Gabriel Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District (SVG Mosquito) conducted residential mosquito control application via truck in the communities of Monterey Park and West Puente Valley. SVG Mosquito will use ultra-low volume adulticide and low volume larvicide applications to target mosquitoes at multiple stages to control the population and reduce the risk of mosquito-borne disease.

District Modernization Project

Solutions Coating Inc began repairing the district pond on October 2, 2025, and completed all ponds repairs on October 7, 2025.
